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Not to be missed!

Welcome to Chamonix valley!

At the crossroad of Switzerland and Italy, Chamonix is the worldwide capital for skiing and mountaineering. Surrounded by its ski resorts spread out on the 4 sides of the valley, most part of the ski area is above 2000 m.

Discover the typical villages of the valley around Chamonix: Servoz, Les Houches, Argentière and Vallorcine !

Also discover:

Aiguille du Midi



Glide up comfortably with the cable car into the high mountains, and reach an altitude of 3842 m (12604 feet)! After a 25 minutes journey, you will enjoy a spectacular view all around you over the Mont Blanc and the French, Swiss and Italian Alps.

Discover:

The Mont-Blanc wing: enjoy an incredible panoramic view from inside, in a warm space, through vast glass windows, over Mont Blanc, Mont Maudit and Mont Blanc du Tacul!

Also discover great photos of mountaineers in action!

The waiting area: discover an incredible adventure of human and technological endeavor:

the construction of the cable car and its imposing machinery.

The highest covered area: this shelter built on the highest terrace at 3842 m gives you the opportunity to hide from the wind and the cold while enjoying a stunning view!

The museum (“Espace vertical”): like a temple dedicated to climbers, mountaineers and mountain adventurers.

It gives you a better understanding of the captivating high mountain world.

The Step into the void: an unforgettable experience!

More than 1000 m of emptiness beneath your feet in a 2m x 2m five-sided glass box!

The Hypoxia platform: discover how your body reacts to the lack of oxygen due to the altitude.

The Tube: this 32m long steel gallery allows you to make a complete tour of the central pillar of the Aiguille du Midi.



Mer de Glace



Facing the Drus and the “Grandes Jorasses”, the Mer de Glace is the longest glacier in France.

From Chamonix, enjoy a marvellous 25 minutes’ ride on board of the famous small red rack and pinion train up to Montenvers area at 1913 m.

Also discover:

- **The "Glaciorium"**: this modern interactive space will give you a better understanding of how glaciers form, exist and evolve over the centuries.
- **The Ice Cave**: enter the entails of the glacier!
Beware: the access to the ice cave is to be made via a gondola partially adapted to people with reduced mobility (a few steps are to be found to access), then 180 steps are to be walked down. At the bottom of the cable car, a large terrace allows you to enjoy plenty the view closer to the glacier.
- **The snowshoeing trails**: open according to snow conditions.

Mont-Blanc Tramway



A journey in a rack and pinion train up to Les Houches – Saint-Gervais ski area, as well as to a signed posted trail for a little walk with or without snowshoes!

Enjoy the panoramic view over the Bionnassay glacier, the Chamonix and Les Contamines valleys!

The Mont Blanc Tramway accepts people with reduced mobility on all its trains, but only two wheel chairs per train.

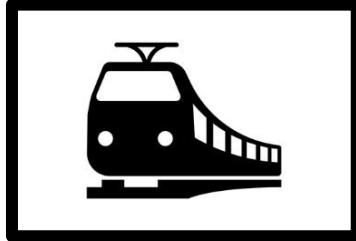

Getting around in the valley!

By train with Mont-Blanc Express



The SNCF railway line serves all villages from Saint-Gervais-Le Fayet until Le Châtelard on the Swiss border, going through Servoz, Les Houches, Chamonix, Argentière and Vallorcine.

One train approximately every hour.

Trains are free from or until Saint-Gervais-Le Fayet train station with the Mont Blanc Unlimited pass.

If there are works on the railway line, buses instead of trains run between Vallorcine and Saint-Gervais-Le Fayet.

By bus



A regular urban transport serves the valley between Servoz and Le Tour villages.

Express bus lines allow you to go to the bottom of the ski areas with specific bus lines.

4-night buses run every day.

Beware: some bus lines or time slots are to be booked over Chamonix Mobility

Prices: online over Chamonix Mobility website or at the tourist offices of the valley.

Bus tickets can be bought online or at Chamonix Mobilité machines located:

- in Chamonix Sud, near Chamonix Mobilité's desk;
- at Chamonix tourist office;
- at Les Houches tourist office;
- at Rocky Pop Hotel in Les Houches;
- at the Youth Hotel in Chamonix.

**Free access to all buses with a ski pass during the day.
The guest card holders will get reductions on the day bus passes (from 2 to 7 days).**

Mobil'bus

This “**on-demand transport**” service grants people with reduced mobility the possibility of travelling through the whole Chamonix valley.

Reserved to:

- people with a disability greater than or equal to 80%;
- people with a limited autonomy.

Access also possible to persons older than 70 years, living far away from a public transport line and having difficulty getting around on his/her own.

Over Chamonix Mobilité App or over its website: book at least 1 hour before taking the Mobil bus.

By phone: call Chamonix Mobilité at 0033 4 50 53 05 55, from Monday to Saturday, except on holidays, from 8am to 7pm, book at least 4 hours before taking the Mobil bus.

Beware:

- **for a reservation between 6am and 8am, book before 7pm on the day before;**
- **for a reservation between 8pm and 9pm, book at 7pm at the latest;**
- **for a reservation on Sunday or on the following Monday, on a holiday or the following day, book at the latest on Saturday or on the day before the holiday, before 7pm.**

By foot! Where to park?

The best way to enjoy stunning views of the panorama is to leave your car in one of the car parks of the valley.

You will get 1 hour free of charge on most Chamonix car parks, for example at the indoor Saint-Michel, Mont-Blanc and Entrèves car parks!

In Chamonix:

- “Centre-ville” pay car park at the entrance of the town behind the Aiguille du Midi cable car, close to a bus stop;
- 3 underground pay car parks;
- 4 outside pay car parks.

Two pay car parks located 200m away from the Chamonix Tourist Office have places for people with reduced mobility:



- **The Outa car park** (car park with barriers) has two places for people with reduced mobility.

To go and visit the Tourist Office from this car park, go on the path on the right side of these car park places, continue in front of the public toilets and then along the car park.

At the end of the car park, continue straight away on the pavement along the Mont-Blanc hotel and its restaurant “Le Matafan”.

You will find the Tourist Office just after the hotel on your left side;

- **The underground Saint-Michel pay car park** has places for people with reduced mobility on the 1st, 3rd and 5th floors: access to these floors possible with a lift.

To reach the Tourist Office from this car park, please go on the bridge located at the pedestrian exit of the car park,

then go down on the access ramp on the left side of the church, continue straight away in front of the Mountain House (Maison de la Montagne) until a second access ramp.

This ramp will directly lead you to the Tourist Office.

In Les Houches:

Free car park in Le Tournet and at the bottom of Bellevue cable car.

A free car park place for people with reduced mobility in front of the souvenirs shop “Le Floch’on” across the tourist office.

In Argentière:

Les Fiz car park, a free car park at the very end of the village:

- on your right side at the exit of the village if you arrive from Chamonix;

- on your left at the entrance of the village if you arrive from Vallorcine.

In Vallorcine:

a specific car park place for people with reduced mobility is to be found on the left side of the tourist office about 20 m away from the entrance door situated in front of the office.

Vehicles with a visible handicapped sticker are allowed to stay for free on Le Buet car park, on the car park close to the cable car and on the one across the tourist office.

The guest card (“carte d’hôte”)



The guest card will be given to you for free by your accommodation provider at your arrival.

It will allow you to take for free the Mont-Blanc-Express train in the valley between Servoz and Vallorcine.

With this card, you will also get discounts on 2 to 7 days bus passes as well as discounts at the swimming pool, the ice rink, for cross country skiing, in the museums of the valley, for car park subscriptions in the Chamonix underground car parks.

If you are hosted for free:

You'll have the opportunity to buy this card for a week in the tourist offices of the valley.

Ask for the «Advantages of the Guest Card» brochure at the Tourist Offices of the valley!

Beware!

The free travel on the local train Mont-Blanc-Express is only valid for a journey beginning and ending in the Chamonix valley, between Servoz and Vallorcine.

Outside this area, the SNCF (the French train line company) requires each passenger to have a valid ticket for the entire journey!

Chamonix Mont Blanc valley includes:

- 4 large high altitude ski areas for downhill skiers of all levels;
- several ski resorts in the valley for beginners and easy ski.

Ski resorts

High altitude ski areas:

- Les Grands Montets ski resort



A mythic ski area on the northern face of the valley.
The spot “par excellence” for off-piste skiing and free riding,
partially on a glacier, open until the beginning of Mai.
A great snow park, a filmed and timed boarder cross.
A DVA park is also available there!

An **easy ski area** is open on “Plateau de Lognan”, but its access is only possible from the arrival of Plan Joran cable car over a blue slope.

Therefore, **this area is not recommended to the very beginners** for whom it will be easier to start below, on Les Chosalets beginner area, or, if this one is closed, on La Vormaine beginner area in Le Tour.

No access to pedestrians as well as to snow shoeing walkers over the whole winter!

• Brévent – Flégère ski resort



«Sunshine» ski area facing the Mont Blanc range.
The southerly slopes of this resort make it a favorite for sun-loving skiers.

On **Brévent ski area**:

- 1 **beginner area** in Planpraz;
- 1 filmed and timed slalom stadium.

On **Flégère ski area**:

- Mont Blanc Legend: free access. Games, barbecue, zip-line. Tables for picnic;
- 1 boarder cross;
- 1 timed speed piste.

Snowshoeing walkers will enjoy nice snowshoeing loops:

- 2 loops below the arrival of Flégère cable car;
- 1 loop at the arrival of Index cable car above Flégère.

- **Balme Le Tour-Vallorcine ski resort**



Skiing between high mountain pastures and forests on the Swiss border.

Access to this area:

- from Le Tour
- or
- from Vallorcine.

On this area, you will discover one of the biggest freestyle spaces of Europe!

On the Vallorcine side, Balme resort offers wide and gentle slopes through a forest of spruces.

• Les Houches ski resort



A large diversity of slopes and atmospheres around the legendary Kandahar downhill slope.

Access to the pistes:

- with Bellevue cable car;
- with Prarion cable car;
- from Col de Voza or Bellevue stations of Mont-Blanc tramway.

2 snowshoeing trails and one loop for cross-country ski (skating only) at the top of Prarion cable car.

For children: the **ski camp** is to be found after a 10 minutes' walk above the arrival of the Prarion cable car:

- Sledging slopes,
- Snowtubing runs according to snow conditions of the moment,
- Zip wires.

Car parks at the bottom of Bellevue and Prarion cable cars.

Wheel chairs are not allowed on Bellevue cable car!

Wheel chairs are allowed on Prarion cable car as well as on the Mont Blanc Tramway (1 wheel chair per train – to be booked at caisses.tmb@compagniedumontblanc.fr)!

Ski areas for beginners in the valley

- **La Vormaine: 0033 9 79 51 73 67**



A very sunny ski area with plenty of snow in Le Tour. Perfect for beginners and medium-level skiers. Ideal for children (day-care center from 3 years old) and for snowboarding beginners.

From there, enjoy a beautiful view over the glacier.

Free car park at the bottom of the ski area.

Right in the middle of ChamoniX, at the bottom of Le Brévent. Ideal slopes for beginners, especially children, served by 2 ski lifts and a moving walkway.

A day-care center from 3 years old children.

Closest car park: Saint-Michel pay car park.

In the town center, the largest ski area for beginners and children!

4 slopes: 1 red, 1 blue and 2 green ones.

1 day-care center from 3 years old.

Bar and restaurant, ski school, sport shop.

At the foot of Les Grands Montets in Argentière.

2 drag lifts expect little and bigger beginners!

Snack bar at the bottom of the pistes.

Cross country tracks and groomed trails for walkers are to be found there.

In the heart of Les Houches village, next to the ice rink, this little ski resort has 2 drag lifts.

Great for learning skiing!

Free car park at the bottom of Le Tournet!

Situated in the hamlet “Le Buet” in Vallorcine, this little family friendly ski resort is a real playground!

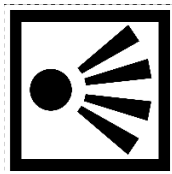
- 2 drag lifts,

- 1 beginner's rope tow.

Pay car park across this ski area, in front of Le Buet train station.

All these ski resorts are accessible with public transportation.

None of these restaurants and cafés are accessible to people with reduced mobility.

Ski schools



Lessons for skiing, snowboarding, freeriding, speed riding, are provided for groups and individuals of all levels!

Some instructors are specially trained as Handiski instructors for people with visual impair or disabled people.

In ski-chair, ski-kart, come and ski whatever your handicap!



Associations to assist people with a disability:

Some mountain guides are trained to assist people with a disability.

Valid on all Chamonix ski resorts, between Le Tour / Vallorcine and Chamonix, between 1.000m and 2.700m.

✓ *Free access to bus lines in the whole valley.*

• “Mont-Blanc Unlimited” pass

Valid on:

- all ski resorts of the valley,
- the Aiguille du Midi cable car,
- the Montenvers train (subject of change),
- the Mont-Blanc Tramway.

With a 2-days or more pass, on presentation of a currently-valid Mont Blanc Unlimited pass and the proof of payment:

- Free and unlimited access to the Courmayeur ski resort in Italy;
- Free access to the Skyway in Italy.
5€ deposit for the key-card;
- Access to the “Evasion Mont-Blanc” ski area : Megève, Saint-Gervais, Les Contamines and Les Portes du Mont-Blanc ;
- 1 free access to Crans-Montana ski resort in Switzerland;
- Reduction at the entrance of the Mont Blanc tunnel on the price of the one-way tickets for light-duty vehicles;
- A better fare on a bus return ticket Chamonix – Courmayeur used on the same day.

With a 3 to 21 days Mont-Blanc Unlimited ski pass:

Please show up at the train station or go and see the train controller with your Mont Blanc Unlimited pass and your payment confirmation (cash desk ticket or E-mail confirmation) before going up in the train in order to get a valid train ticket.

If you want to ski only on the Bellevue-Prarion ski resort in Les Houches, you can buy a pass for Les Houches ski resort alone!
